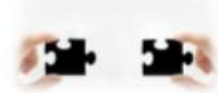


Appendix A: Match Up – Answer Key

Word	Definition
Intersex	Historically, a derogatory term for homosexuality, used to insult LGBT people. Although still used as a slur by some, the term has been reclaimed by some members of LGBT communities, particularly youth. In its reclaimed form it can be used as a symbol of pride and affirmation of difference and diversity, or as a means of challenging rigid identity categories.
Cisgender	A heterosexual and/or cisgender person who supports queer identities and interrupts or challenges queer-phobic and heterosexists comments and actions
Ally	How one outwardly manifests gender; for example, through name and pronoun choice, style of dress etc.
Queer	A term used by some North American Aboriginal societies to describe people with diverse gender identities, gender roles and sexual orientations.
Passing/To Pass	An individual having reproductive organs or external sexual characteristics of both male and female.
Two Spirit	A person who does not identify either fully or in part with the gender associated with their birth-assigned sex—often used as an umbrella term to represent a wide range of gender identities and expressions.
Gender Expression	Refers to a person whose biological sex assigned at birth matches their gender identity.
Gay	The view that there are only two totally distinct opposite and static genders (masculine and feminine) to identify with and express.
Transgender	A person mostly attracted to those of the same gender; often used to refer to men only.
Gender Binary	A term sometimes use to refer to the stat of an LGBTQ2+ person not being visibly recognizable as LGBTQ2+. This term is most commonly used in relation to trans people.
